# Twenty-eight schools involved in Open cross-country at Les Quennevais

# Record-breaking

THERE were a record number of finishers at the Jersey Primary Schools' Open cross country held at Les Quennevais last Wednesday afternoon.

Children from 28 schools took part and their efforts were once again recognised by leading sports stars as good luck tweets were sent from Paula Radcliffe, Jessica Ennis and Bradley Wiggins.

Boys and girls' races were held for Year-5 and Year-6 pupils, the younger group covering around 1,500 metres round the playing field and on the Railway Walk while the Year-6s did an extra loop resulting in 2,000 metres.

There were individual and team races, the latter calculated by adding up the top three finishing positions of each school with the lowest score winning.

Skye Leather, of St Martin, won the Yr-5 girls' race in the fast time of five minutes and five seconds. Beaulieu's Lucy Hunt was second and St Luke's Lilly Scott third.

Beaulieu won the team race through Hunt, Hope Herridge and Paige Higgins, the latter pair who placed eighth and tenth overall.

Victoria College Preparato-ry's Oli Rothwell won the Yr-5 boys' race in a fast 4.32. St Mary's Jacob Stanton and St Lawrence's Noah Trench were

second and third respectively. VCP also had the lowest team score, courtesy of Rothwell's victory backed up by Freddie Pollard and George Daniels placing fourth and

sixth respectively. In the Y6 girls' race, February's Y5 winner Kirsty Ludlam, of the Jersey College for Girls, led for much of the race before team-mate Elissa Polak stormed ahead to win in six minutes and three seconds.

Ludlam placed second and St Michael's Ella Warner

Ninth place by Lili King secured Polak and Ludlam the team prize for JCG.

St Clement's Luke Killian followed up February's Yr-5 boys' win by winning the Yr-6 section. Killian crossed the finishing line in five minutes and 40 seconds after

leading throughout.

James Sunley (VCP) placed second and Pedro Da-Assunçao third.

The College also won the team event through Sunley, Chris Thomas (fifth) and Joshua Abbott (tenth).
